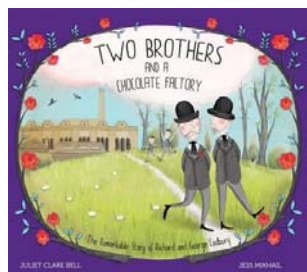

TWO BROTHERS AND A CHOCOLATE FACTORY – The remarkable story of Richard and George Cadbury

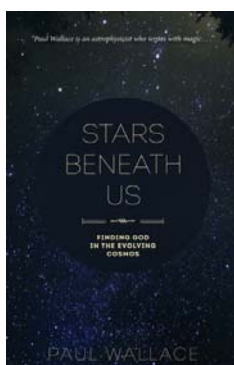
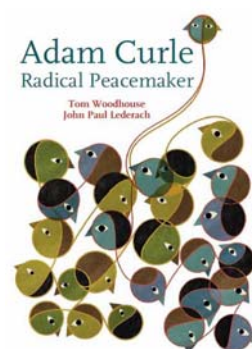
Juliet Clare Bell & Jess Mikhail £11.99

STARS BENEATH US – Finding God in the evolving cosmos

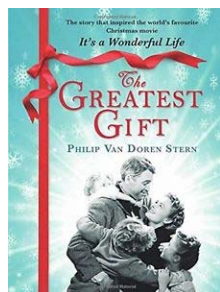
Paul Wallace £9.99

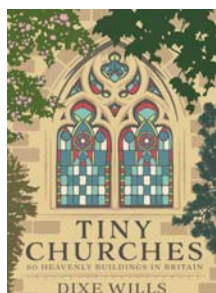
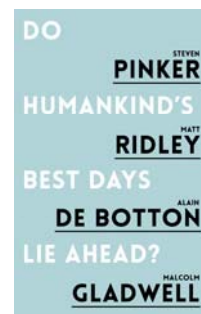

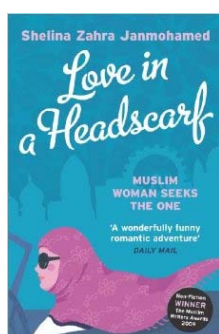
TINY CHURCHES Dixie Wills £16.99

Dolobran Friends Meeting House, built at the turn of the 18th century, is featured in *Tiny Churches* and is believed to be the oldest Quaker meeting house in Wales.

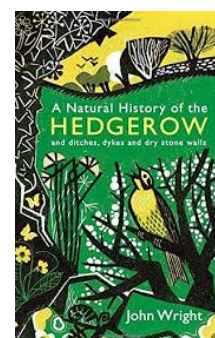
LOVE IN A HEADSCARF – Muslim woman seeks the one Shelina Zahra Janmohamed £7.99

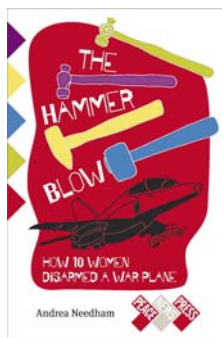

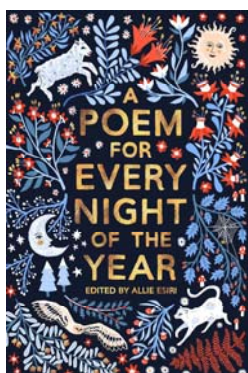
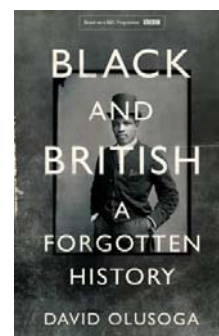


THE HAMMER BLOW – How 10 women disarmed a war plane Andrea Needham £10

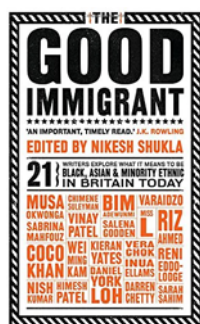
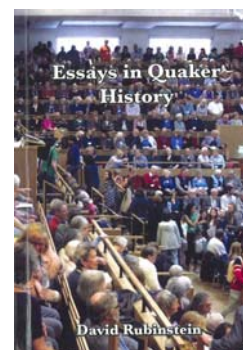


A POEM FOR EVERY NIGHT OF THE YEAR Edited by Allie Esiri £16.99

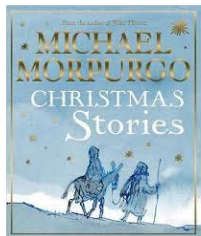
ESSAYS IN QUAKER HISTORY David Rubinstein £12.99

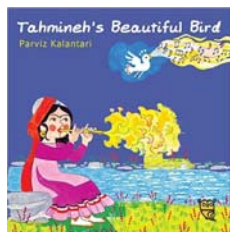
Michael Morpurgo £14.99

TAHMINAH'S BEAUTIFUL BIRD

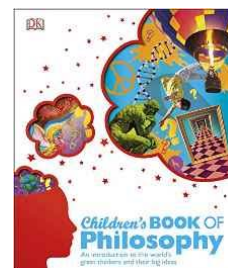
Parviz Kalantari £11.99
