

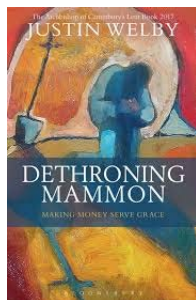

Justin Welby £9.99

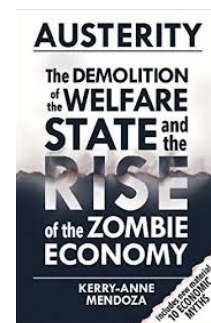

AUSTERITY – The Demolition of the Welfare State and the Rise of the Zombie Economy

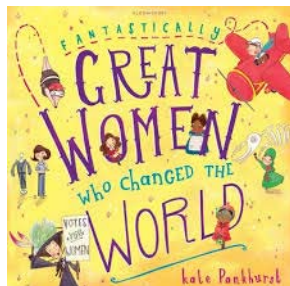
Kerry-Anne Mendoza £9.99

Kate Pankhurst £6.99

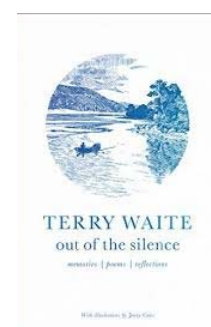


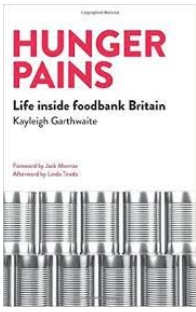

At the height of the Lebanese civil war in the 1980s, over a hundred foreign civilians were taken hostage by Islamic Jihad. As the Archbishop of Canterbury's special envoy, Quaker Terry Waite conducted several successful missions to negotiate the release of numerous hostages. But in January 1987, while on one of his many visits to Beirut, he was captured himself. In this moving sequence of poetry and prose, Terry Waite recalls the highs and lows of his life, both during his ordeal as a hostage and in the happier years of humanitarian work that have followed. In doing so, he gives us a glimpse into the depths of faith, hope and love that sustained him through his years of suffering. At the same time, he bears witness to the enduring qualities of forgiveness, truth and reconciliation that are so desperately needed in the world today.





HUNGER PAINS – Inside Foodbank Britain

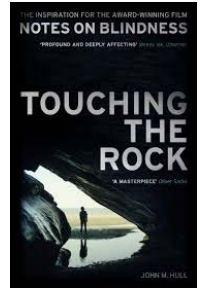
Kayleigh Garthwaite £9.99

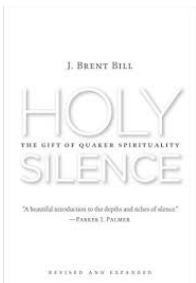


HOLY SILENCE – The Gift of Quaker Spirituality
