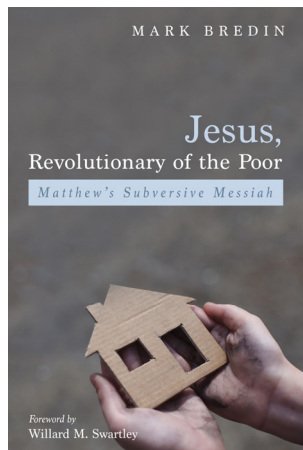

### JESUS, REVOLUTIONARY OF THE POOR: Matthew's Subversive Messiah

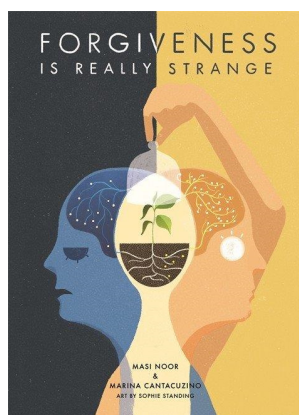
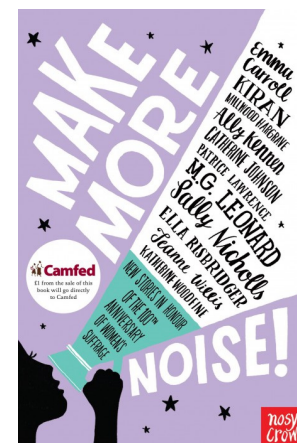
**Mark Bredin £23.00**

### FORGIVENESS IS REALLY STRANGE

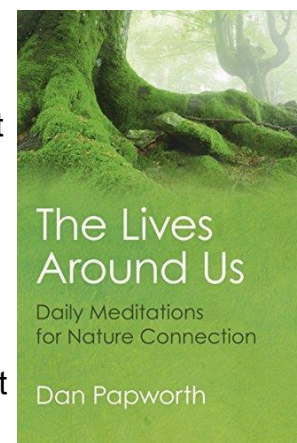

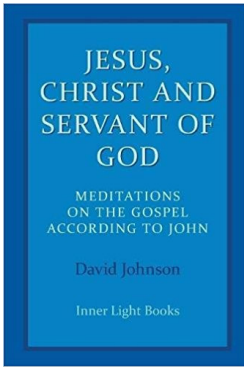

Its purpose is to tap into the present public interest in nature connection and encourage this to be formed in concert with Bible reading and regular (daily or weekly) prayer. Each chapter begins with descriptive reflection on a specific creature (animal, plant, fungus, mineral) followed by one or two thoughts about what we can do for them practically. There is a Bible reading and then a section that encourages prayer and sometimes a prayerful activity. This unique book offers a deep spirituality that is fully present and connected to the world we live in and that of the Spirit.





**JESUS, CHRIST AND SERVANT OF GOD: Meditations on the Gospel according to John**

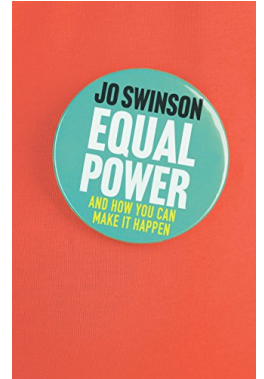
**David Johnson £20.00**

The narrative of Jesus' ministry in the Gospel according to John forms a very clear teaching about the spiritual life, offering parallels to the spiritual lessons and changes we each go through.
