Information for Quaker clerks

A chance to contribute to discernment on the future of Central Committees

Yearly Meeting 2023 asked BYM trustees to consider what form a new committee structure could take. In August 2023 the Group to Review Central Structures (GRCS) was formed, bringing together Friends with wide experience of our current committee structure. GRCS now needs feedback from Friends on its proposal of creating a single central committee to replace Quaker Life Central Committee and Quaker Peace & Social Witness Central Committee.

GRCS does not expect that area meetings will be able to spend time now looking in detail at this consultation. There are many individual Friends with interest and expertise and GRCS hopes to hear from them, as well as from any informal grouping or meeting that is able to consider the proposal.

After this consultation closes, GRCS will consider all the feedback received and then send final proposals to BYM trustees. Any firm proposals for change to the central committee structure will then go forward to Yearly Meeting for discernment and decision. At that stage further material will be provided to help Friends and meetings prepare to take part in that discernment.

Welcome Directory

The Welcome Directory is a multi-faith organisation committed to combatting social isolation and loneliness in the prison leaver community. It does this by empowering faith communities to offer lasting welcome and challenge the public stigma that so many prison leavers face. Their national directory of welcoming faith communities is a

key resource available for prison leavers, prison chaplains and resettlement teams in all prisons and Approved Premises across England and Wales to facilitate faith-based community connections.

Ahead of the early release of over 5,000 more individuals from prison this September, the need for their work is even more essential. Of our 420 faith communities registered in The Welcome Directory, there are only 14 Quaker meetings. The Welcome Directory would like to do more to better serve the Quaker community – could your Quaker Meeting register?

Including your meeting within the directory can better serve Quaker prison leavers, enabling them to continue their faith journey on the outside, and ultimately **break the cycle of re-offending**. The free Prisons Awareness Course is intended for faith communities with no experience of prison, imprisonment or release to better understand the issues. Registration is quick and easy, through the online form or you can get in touch if you have any questions.
