

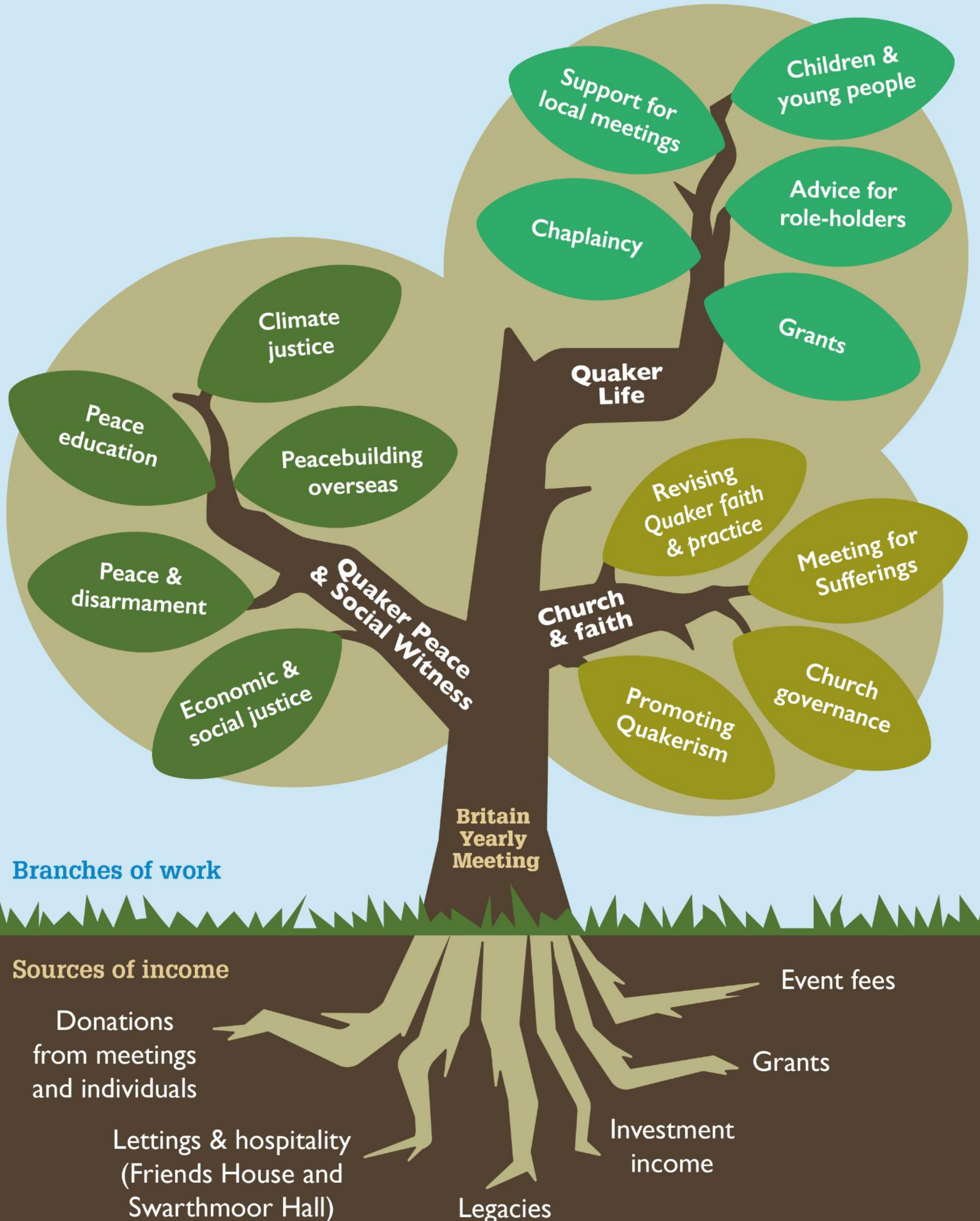
Supporting centrally managed Quaker work

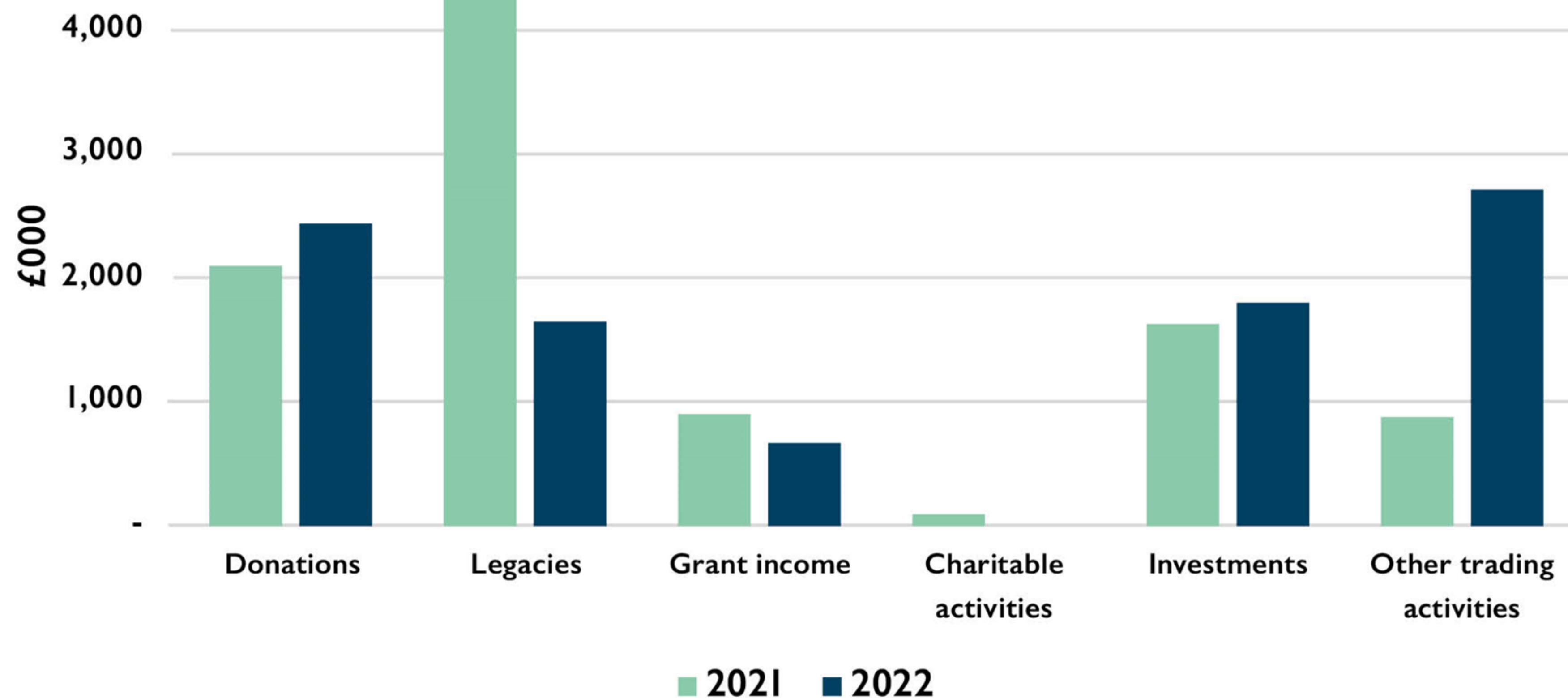


What does Britain Yearly Meeting do?

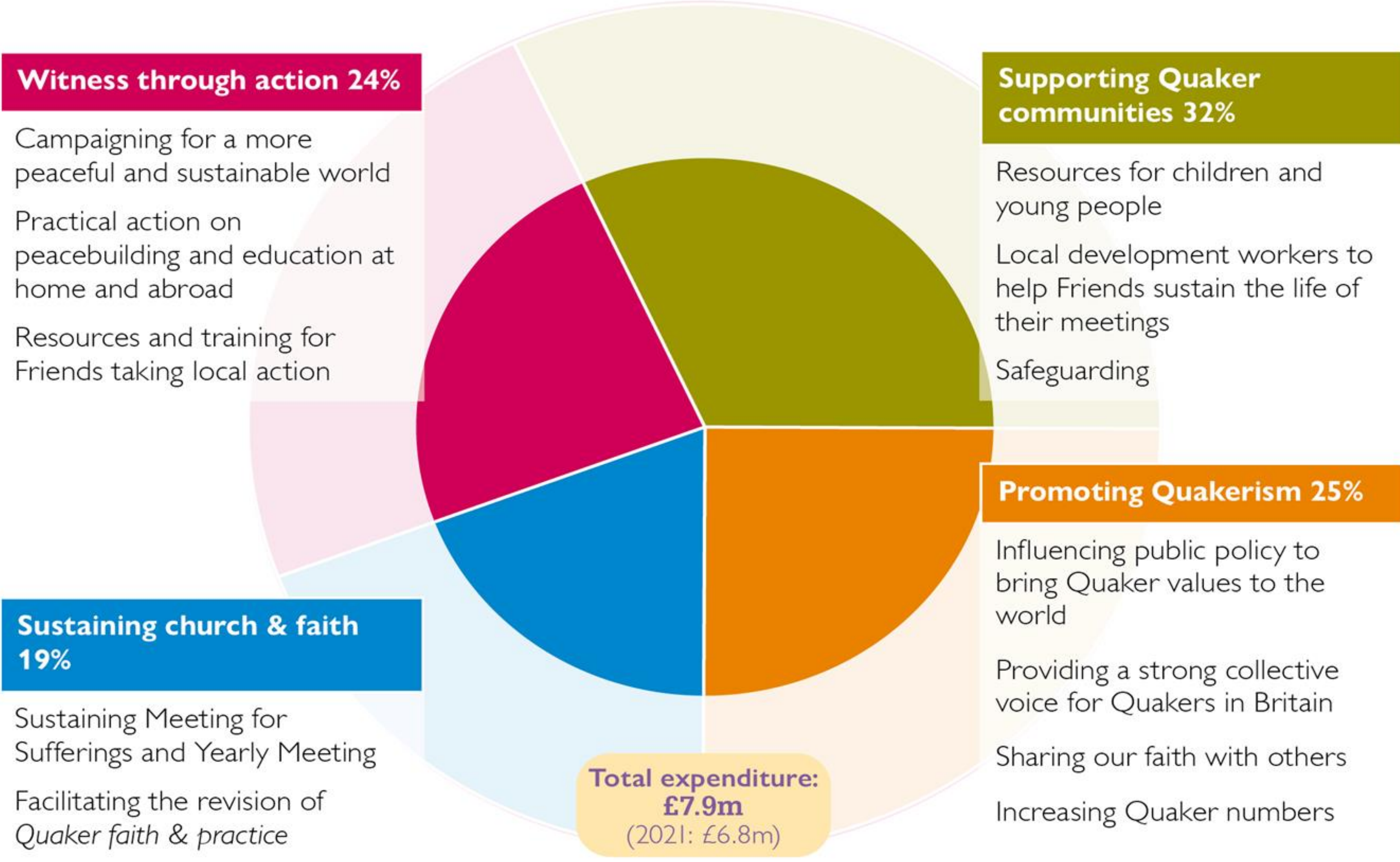


In 2022, income from trading showed a strong recovery with legacy income significantly down on an unusual year in 2021.

The challenge & how you can help

- Inflationary pressures mean that it costs more for us to deliver the work Friends want us to do
- More of the centrally managed work of Friends will need to be sustained by direct support from Friends
