Junior Yearly Meeting

This is a residential event for 15 to 18 year olds at the Frontier Centre near Northampton. It provides a programme designed by the Arrangements Committee (young people appointed at JYM in 2018) that explores topics being considered by Yearly Meeting in 2019. There will also be young people taking on the role of Base Group Facilitator at the event. Team members will need to be available from early evening on Thursday 11 April to the afternoon of Monday 15 April. There is a team weekend 8 – 10 February and a day alongside the arrangements committee and base group facilitators on Saturday 16 March, both in Hemel Hempstead. Up to ten volunteers are required. Yearly Meeting children and young people's programmes (24 – 27 May)

Children's Programme

For 0 to 11 year olds there will be up to four age groups offering appropriate programmes to children that link with the Yearly Meeting topics.
