We learn from each other and make decisions together, without relying on religious teachers or authorities. Everyone is equal in a Quaker community.



Radical

Quaker communities welcome everyone. We celebrate our differences, whether those lie in our race, class, age, sexuality, identity or elsewhere. Community can be hard and we don't always get it right, but it offers us opportunities to grow.

We want to create a fair and compassionate society, where everyone is included.

Quakers challenge injustice and discrimination, speaking truth to power. We work for peace and aim to overcome the root causes of war and climate breakdown.

Quakers try to live adventurously, taking risks for a fairer and more peaceful world.



Spiritual

At a Quaker meeting people sit quietly together. Anyone may be inspired to speak. These times of shared stillness are where we find the strength and inspiration for everything we do.

Quakers recognise that spiritual truth is found in all people, cultures and religions.

Quakers value children's spirituality as equal to that of adults and encourage them to explore it in their own ways. Being part of a Quaker community can offer families of all kinds the loving support they need to thrive.



Quakers in Britain

Quakers in Britain are a radical and inclusive faith community. We work with others to create a more just and peaceful world.

There are Quaker communities in most towns and cities in Britain. They usually meet weekly to share the unique experience of Quaker worship together. People of all ages and backgrounds are welcome, including families of all kinds.
