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Simpler Meetings

- Find ways to reduce the administrative burdens on key role holders, mainly:
 AM trustees, AM treasurers and AM clerks.
- To liberate Quakers for spiritual nurture, community building, outreach and witness.

4 elements of the project

- Find and share ways that work for Friends
- Focused work with a few AMs on significant changes
- Develop model policies and templates for AMs
- Promote a culture of simplicity in the support offered by BYM
 - 3 year project: 1 worker + small budget Not national structures etc.

- A relatively small group, often 70+
- Overburdened and not sustainable.
- Declining membership and attendance
- Ageing society
 Joining later
- Modern lives
 Single Quaker households
- Complex regulation Register small charities by March 2021

For any roleholder 1

Is the role clear?

- ? Divide or combine roles: using skills and time. Delegating.
- Support person admin, IT, technical
- Flexibility

Fitting people into roles, or fitting tasks to people's skills?

For any roleholder 2

- Handover and induction

- Training large and small
- National resources in print and on BYM website

Support from a buddy, former roleholders, other AMs, BYM

Get together to share ideas and support – area and wider

Area Meetings & role holders

- Review other roles much?
- Could share some roles with other AMs?
 - Safeguarding, Registering Officer etc
- **Relationships and interactions?**

Review key roles: AM Clerk, Treasurer, Clerk of Trustees

Do we really need them all? Trying to cover too

For trustees

Role clarity

- Relationship with Area Meeting decisions & duplication
- Prioritise
- Use sub-groups ? Include non-trustees on sub-groups ?
- Work with neighbouring Areas Meetings ?
- Adapt and adopt model policies instead of re-inventing wheels

Already :

- Employment: Disciplinary, Grievance, Sickness, Annual Leave, Employee data protection,
- Whistleblowing, Data Protection
- Next few months:
 - Safeguarding
 - Risk
 - Health & Safety
- More to follow...

Employees could work for more than one AM

One AM could act as employer for others

Some are using contractors for some roles, rather than employees - to reduce employment risks



For Treasurers

- Sharing and dividing role
- Meet, talk, share
- Common systems one treasurer can cover another
- Electronic banking including dual authorisation
- Bookkeepers carries load, reduces issues
- Online accounts packages all is clear and entered once
 - And there's one more ...

Managing property

- Combining small property trusts, or use same trustees?
- Work with other AMs sharing systems, suppliers?
- A property trust serving several area meetings?
 - Major finances, Major projects
 - Managing buildings
 - Maintenance, utilities, lettings, employment...
- Comprehensive property management service ?
- Focus on increasing income to pay for support ?

Meeting Houses

Meetings are doing these:

- Move to a more useful place
- Use for a social purpose
- Meet in another room, re-use the space
- Sell and then rent a meeting room
- Meet in people's homes (or in a barn!)

26% of local meetings in Britain do not have a meeting house

= 126

Area Meeting occasions

- AM is a decision making meeting and a community
- Worship, community, concerns, appointments, decisions, learning, overlaps with trustees
- Frequency, time/day, location, length, style, eldership/discipline, inclusion, food !
- ? A group doing preparation + ? some business between AMs
- Could we do some things with another AM?

Could we group Meetings differently?

- Small local meetings do not have to do everything !
- What about:

 - Pairing a large and small meeting
 - - meetings and worshipping groups

Clusters of meetings and worshipping groups Several small LMs become a single LM with several

Do we really need 70+ charities?

Some options:

- Dissolve, and LMs join other AMs.
- Single group of trustees for 2 AMs
- Merge some AMs completely
- Merge AM charities and trustees, continuing to meet as AMs for worship, community, appointments, concerns etc

Is it so bad to pay people?

- Bookkeeper
- Managing lettings
- Property maintenance service Administrator (eg for AM clerk, membership)
- Local development worker Vibrancy
- Youth worker...
