All-together worship at Yearly Meeting

Sunday 25 May 2025, 10:30 to 11:30am

This will be a huge meeting for worship, taking place across Britain. We will come together as a single, loving, inclusive and all-age community across the length and breadth of Britain Yearly Meeting.

We invite local Quaker communities to take part via a live link. We hope to make available a list of participating meetings so that those wishing to attend in person can do so wherever they are in the country. We hope that those unable to connect online will either join others connecting online locally, or worship with us together in spirit.

If your Quaker community wishes to join all-together worship, please read the details below. If an individual or family wishes to join, they should either join a local Quaker community in person or register to attend Yearly Meeting online.

Please complete the online form by 11 May.

The plan

This is currently being finalised and more information will be available in April.

There will be activities for all present - in Friends House, at home and those joining in their local meeting and these will be shared in advance with everyone registered for this and as an additional Journeys in the Spirit.

It is expected that the children will leave at a suitable time to continue ageappropriate activities in their programmes and Meetings.

Joining online as a meeting

Option 1: Zoom

You will be able to see and hear all the ministry and anyone attending your meeting will be able to minister too (separate details will be provided on how to do this).

You will need:

- 1. A computer with a webcam and microphone
- 2. Access to the internet (this could even be a temporary mobile connection)
- 3. A "Zoom elder"

The role of the Zoom elder

The Zoom elder will ensure the equipment is set up, 'raise hand' (in Zoom) if someone locally wishes to minister, unmute the microphone when asked to. If you are unable to provide a Zoom elder, use option 2.

This option is for those meeting in person only. If you are holding an online or blended meeting, those connecting online will need to register for Yearly Meeting and connect to All-Together Worship directly.

Setting up the equipment

You will need to set up your computer so that those in the meeting are visible and can see the screen. Some people may prefer not to be on screen. That is OK. What is important is that the microphone you use is able to pick up people's voices clearly. If you have not done this before, it is worth testing this in advance.

Option 2: YouTube

You will be able to see and hear all ministry, but it will not be possible to share local ministry with the rest of the yearly meeting.

You will need:

- 1. A computer (no webcam or microphone required)
- 2. Access to the internet (either via a broadband connection, a mobile wifi, or a mobile phone hotspot)

All-together in spirit

If you are not able to join us online, you can still use the resources we send you to join in worship with the rest of the Yearly Meeting, in spirit, helping to extend our huge meeting for worship across Britain.

Joining as an individual or family

The online options described above are for local Quaker communities. If you wish to join as an individual or family, you have three options:

- 1. To attend online, register for Yearly Meeting
- 2. To attend in person, join a local participating meeting (a list will be published on the YM website by 13 May)
- 3. To join offline in spirit, use the resources that will be circulated

Next steps for meetings

- 1. Complete the <u>all-together worship registration form (for meetings)</u> by 11 May.
